Stoseph Jalin named Gakubowski replacement

The Great Humongous Secretary of the Central Commission for Discipline Inspection

n Monday, March 27, only ten days after he was selected for the position, Jerald S. Gakubowski stepped down from the Hose-Rulman presidency. I must wait until I receive a directive handed down from the student body; only then will I institute change," said Jalin.

During his presidency, Sulbert became friends with many students. According to Jalin, Sulbert's connection to the students was an important part of his legacy: "The institute is here to serve the student, and we cannot serve the student without listening to him. That lesson was forgotten with [Sulbert's successor] Mack Jidgley, but I assure you, comrades, I will remember it."

The passing of last month's bill in the Alabama state legislature to reclassify evolution as a religious belief has had some unexpected consequences as pharmaceutical companies worldwide have rushed to move their research and development to the state. Final Fantasy 7 DVD release delayed to 2015

Yesterday, during this year's Game Developers Conference, Sony Pictures Home Entertainment announced that it will delay the release of its highly-anticipated *Final Fantasy 7: Advent Children* Two-Disc Special Edition DVD indefinitely until 2015. Originally, this DVD was confirmed for release in the U.S. on April 25, but due to unexpected translation problems and other pressing issues on Sony's agenda, the launch date will be pushed back once more.

The movie is based on *Final Fantasy VII*, one of the best-selling video games of all time, having sold over 9 million copies to date. The movie continues the game's storyline with such memorable characters as Cloud, Tifa, and Barrett. Two years after *FF7* and the death of Sephiroth, Cloud and his comrades must take up arms again to battle a new threat that is looking for something disturbing, while a mysterious illness is spreading among the children of Midgar.

This troubling news couldn't have come at a worser time, as Sony had just delayed the release of its PS3 gaming system until November a few weeks before. Many fans of the movie were already in lines across the U.S. in front of Best Buys, Wal-Marts, Targets, and other retail stores waiting to get their hands on the DVD on April 25. Now, due to the delay, millions of fans are filled with as much animosity toward Sony as they had toward Sephiroth when he killed Aeris, a key figure in the game loved by millions of FF7 fans.

At some places, fans are staging sitting strikes and hunger strikes in response to this delaying madness by Sony. One particular group in front of Grauman's Movie Mania in Hollywood has reportedly made a vow to camp out day

and night non-stop until Sony finally releases the DVD in stores.

"We are not going to take this sitting down," said Steve Nehc, the lead organizer of the group, "we have already waited too long for it to come out." When asked how the new release date would affect his group's promise, Nehc replied, "We will wait here until Sony realizes how much fans truly want this DVD, and finally succumbs to our desire."

In a press conference after the announcement, Sony outlined several major reasons for delaying the DVD in spite of its popularity. Primarily, after the movie was translated and dubbed into English with voice-overs, Sony found out several minor but significant portions of the movie were done in bad English. To save face, examples of poorly-written lines were not given at the time of the conference. It was speculated that the poor translation are along the lines of "Let's blocking", "I feel asleep", and "All your base are belong to us."

As stated by Ken Kutaragi, CEO of Sony Computer Entertainment, this translation error was not the biggest reason for the delay. One other cause was Sony's increasing shift of focus and resources to get its PS3 system finished in time and start the development of its supposed next-next gen system codenamed...gasp...PS4.

Roll your own adventure

When I heard that the company Leafsquishy was ready to release a game called *Cannabis*, I was ecstatic. The game is unlike any modern game, and is reminiscent of the old text adventures.

When I went to the big gaming expo G3 last year, I got to play a demo. This stuff is hot, people. As lackadaisically responsive as *Doom III* on a 300 MHz and as puzzling as *Zork: Grand Inquisitor*, I'm sure this game will be a hit with the Hose crowd.

Like some of the greatest text adventures ever written, you're started out with just a prompt. "What do I type?" you ask. "What is my goal?"

The goal is set by each player. Wander around. Explore. Nibble on whatever you find. I can guarantee you'll get feedback, and once you learn some of the system, you can even advance to a level that will even have you using your mouse to examine various surfaces.

Unfortunately, there's a bit of a steep learning curve. While most text-based adventures use simple commands based on plain English (e.g., "look at llama"), *Cannabis* requires you to master commands with such indecipherable names as "isqrt", "taylor", and "abs".

Even when the command names seem straightforward, such as with "goto" or "pointto", you have to know the exact inwww.linux.lk April 4. Though

game address of wherever you want to go. Instead of "go to nude beach," you have to type "goto 140," which makes it harder for the plot to really come to life.

"Seems slowpaced and dumb," you grump. First, don't grump at me. Second, this game can occupy your time for entire days, trust me. Be careful letting others set how much you should achieve in

Cannabis, though—outsiders' expectations are often outrageously time consuming, and really, who needs aspirations?

Unfortunately, again, like some text adventures, you'll find your-self again and again refining your technique to make the experience richer. That can be really fricking annoying at times, but the completion of each of your goals will bring you a joy like no

other.

The graphics in *Cannabis* are awesome given the game's budget and text-based style, but the default color scheme is just plain icky.

Little things aside, Cannabis is a great game with an open-ended plot and almost infinite replay value. Purchase *Cannabis* when it's released and learn to roll your own adventure.

Recently, for one of my classes - I think it was Science Fiction - I was assigned to read a book called *Signal Processing First. SPF*, for those of you who don't know it, is a postmodern/absurdist science fiction/adventure story co-authored by not two but three writers. I can't actually remember the names, but take my word for it, they're not from around here.

At least, that's my only explanation for the complete, unflagging weirdness of their debut work.

Signal Processing First centers around the existence of two separate dimensions, "Discrete Time" and "Real Time."

The plot begins when "Real Time", which seems a lot like our own universe, is afflicted with a plague of math; some people from "Discrete Time" attempt to come to the rescue but the task is made more difficult by the alleged differences between the universes, which are never fully explained.

Unfortunately, almost the entire thing is written from the perspective of "Discrete Time" inhabitants. Because their timestream is somehow completely different from ours, nothing they do makes any sense. As if that wasn't bad enough, both universes use some kind of "function"

technology for space travel, time travel, and apparently whatever else the authors want. If you're already lost, you're not alone.

I wanted to like Signal Processing First, but throughout I was annoyed by the implausibility of the authors' world. 
